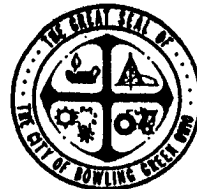


Dear Mr. Lake:

If you have any questions or comments please feel free to contact me. Thank you for your time and consideration.

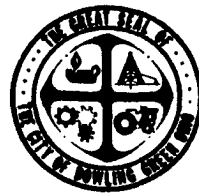
